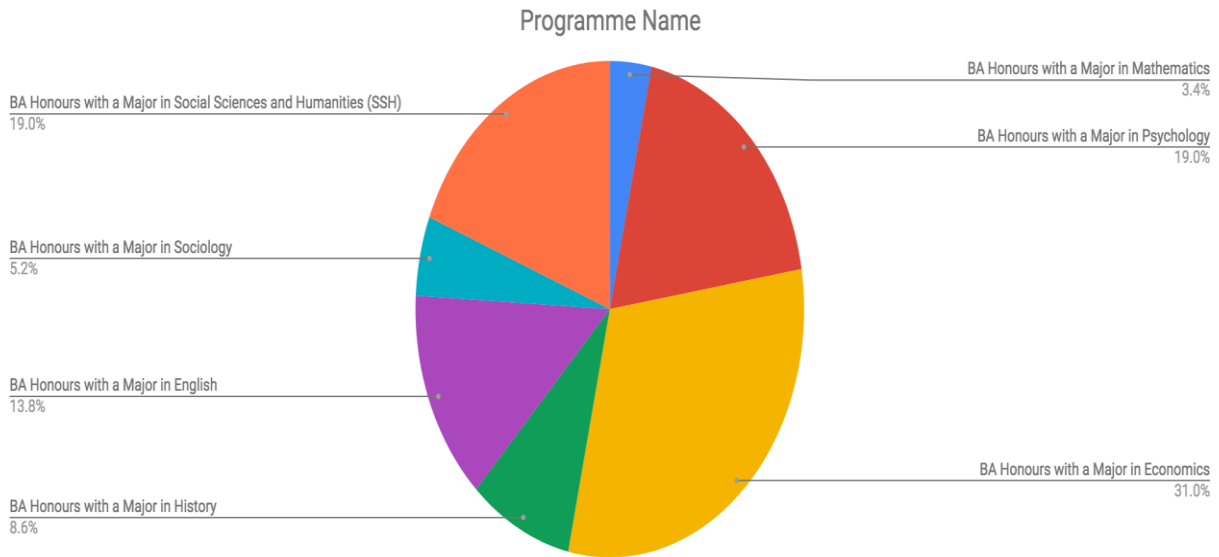


**Undergraduate Alumni Survey**  
**Preliminary Data Analysis**  
**February 2018**

A survey questionnaire was developed to gauge at the views of alumni of Ambedkar University, Delhi with regard to the programmes of study. This alumni survey is part of the Decennial Review of the University which proposes to look at student and alumni satisfaction among other things.

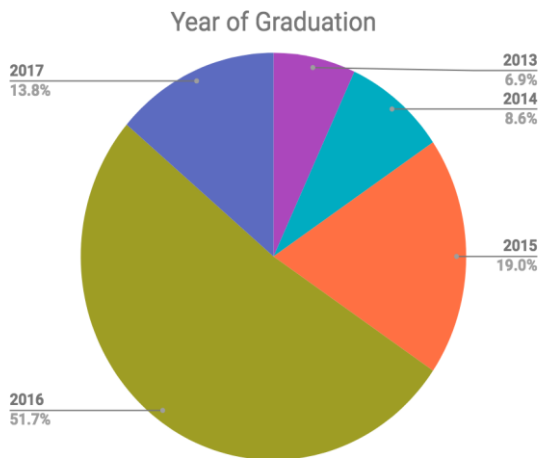
This alumni survey questionnaire was developed over a period two weeks through an iterative process. The internal core group for the Decennial Review was involved in planning, drafting and finalizing this questionnaire. Once finalized, two separate Google Forms were created - one seeking demographic information and the other seeking anonymous programme related feedback. These Google survey forms were shared with the alumni through Deans of their respective schools.

As of February 23<sup>rd</sup> 2018, the University has received a total of 58 programme feedback responses from alumni of undergraduate programmes. The survey responses reveal the

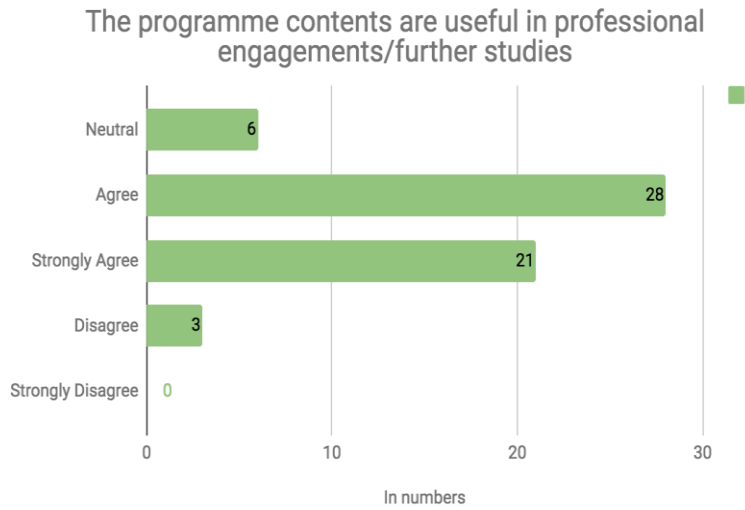


following:

18 out of 58 (**31%**) alumni have graduated BA Honors with a major in **Economics**.

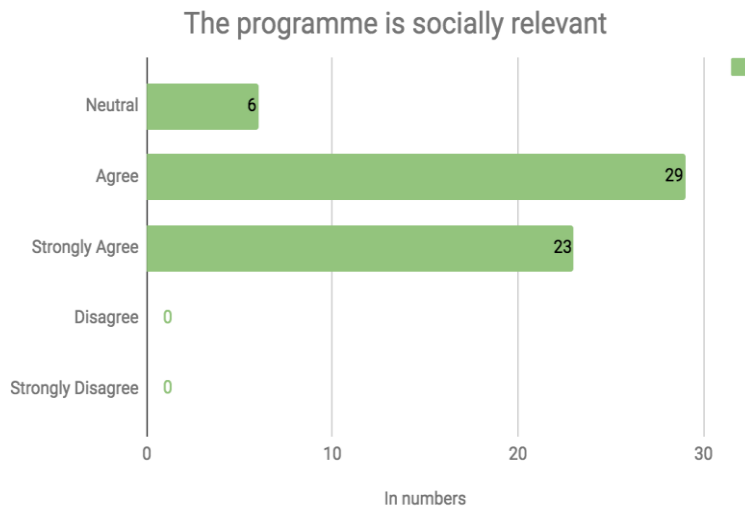


A little over half (**51%**) of the respondents have graduated in the year **2016**.

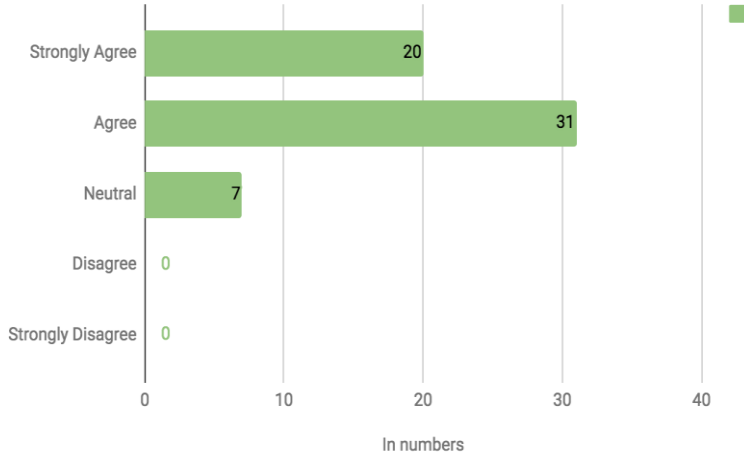


Out of 58 alumni, while 28 (48%) agree and 21 (36%) strongly agree that the programme contents are useful in professional engagements/further studies, 3 (5%) disagree with this statement. 6 (10%) are neutral.

23 (39%) strongly agree and 29 (50%) agree that the programme is socially relevant. 6 (10%) are neutral on the statement.

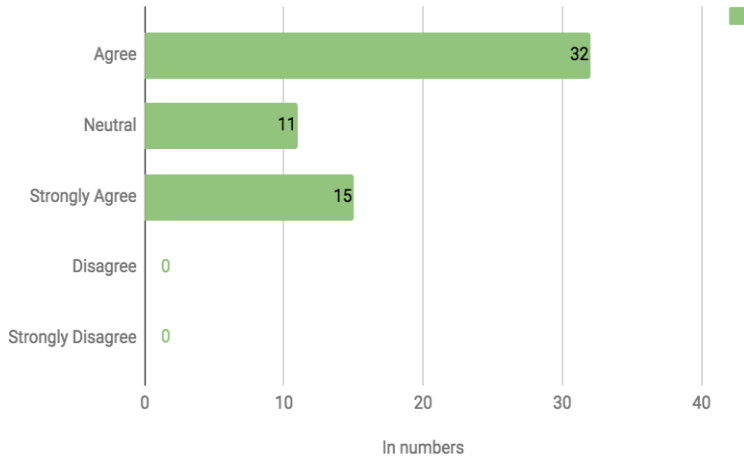


The programme learning objectives were clear



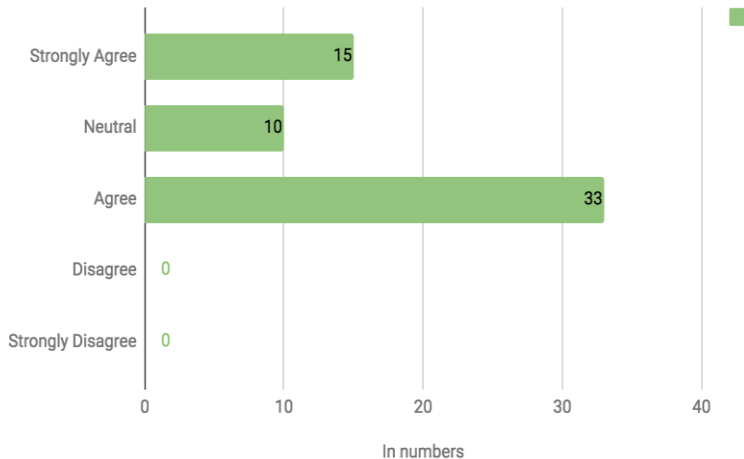
31 (53%) and 20 (34%) alumni agree and strongly agree respectively with the statement that the programme learning objectives were clear. 7 (12%) are neutral.

The programme contents were well planned and organised



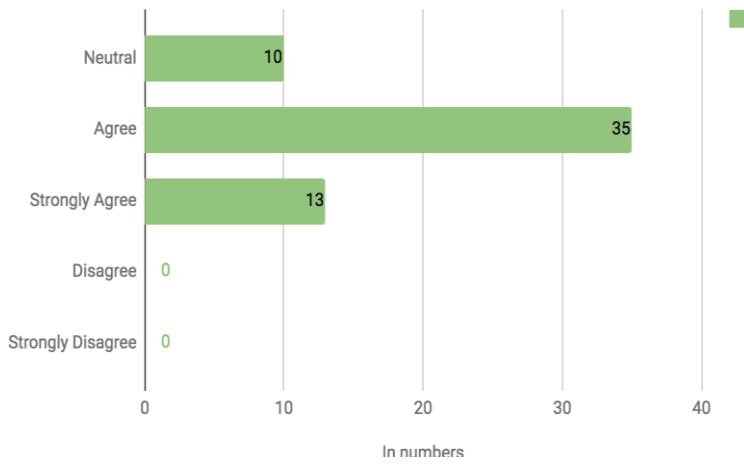
32 (55%) and 15 (25%) alumni agree and strongly agree that the programme contents were well planned and organised. 11 (18%) are neutral.

Course instruction across the courses was well organised and paced



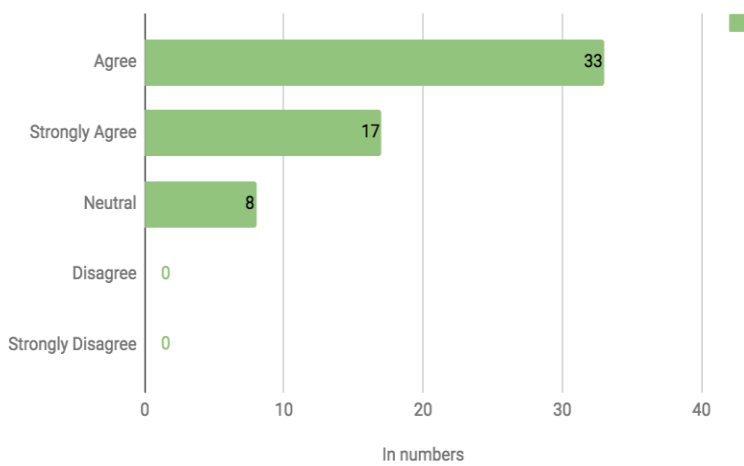
33 (56%) and 15 (25%) alumni agree and strongly agree respectively that course instruction across the courses was well organised and paced. 10 (17%) are neutral.

The courses were even in terms of quality of learning experience



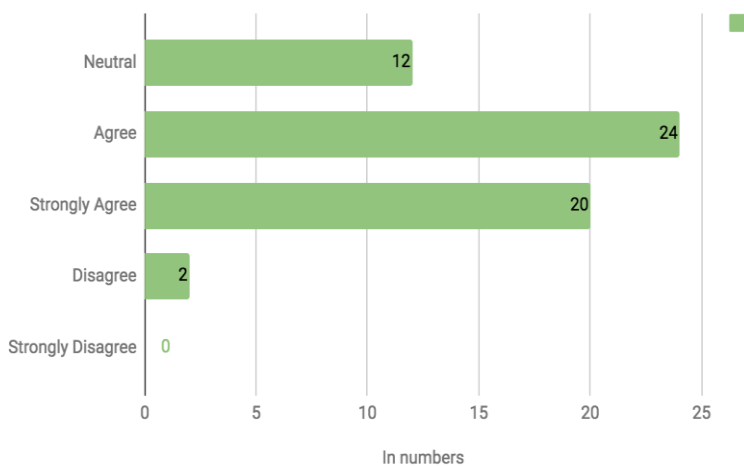
35 (60%) and 13 (22%), alumni agree and strongly agree respectively that the courses were even in terms of quality of learning experience. 10 (17%) are neutral.

The courses were relevant and interesting

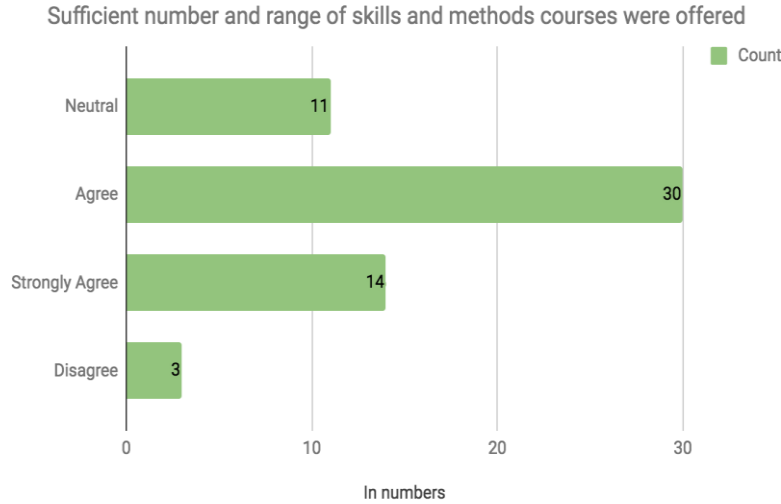


33 (56%) and 17 (29%) alumni agree and strongly agree respectively with the statement that the courses were relevant and interesting. 8 (13%) are neutral about this statement.

Tutorials were held regularly and academic guidance was provided



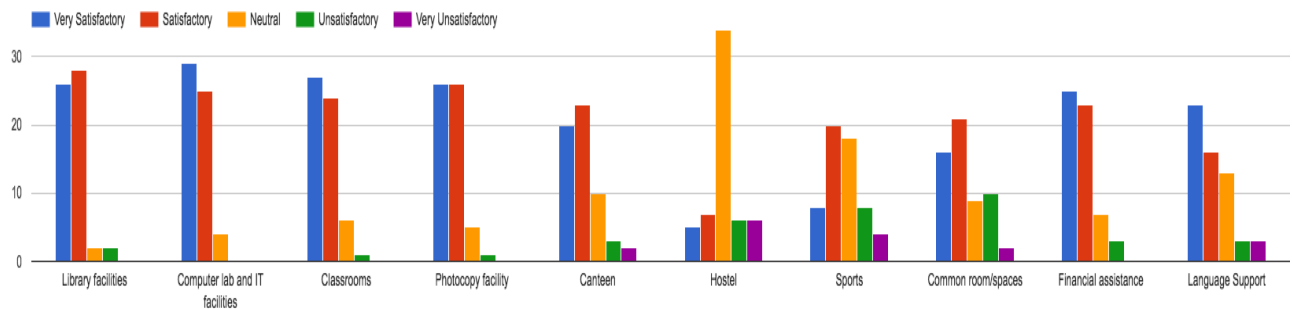
24 (41%) and 20 (34%) alumni agree and strongly agree respectively that tutorials were held regularly and academic guidance was provided. 2 (3%) alumni disagree with this statement while 12 (20%) are neutral.



30 (51%) alumni agree and 14 (24%) strongly agree that sufficient number and range of skills and methods courses were offered to them. 11 (19%) are neutral while 3 (5%) disagree.

The alumni are generally satisfied with the availability of instructional resources at AUD. These include library facilities (44%), computer lab and IT facilities (50%), classrooms (46%), photocopy facility (44%), financial assistance (43%), and language support (39%).
